

PRESIDENTIAL

Dear and Gentle Readers,

History tends to repeat! Six years ago we saw the first Nissan Mobil 500 races on the Wellington streets. When the organisers of this meeting were planning their events, they had the bright idea that the inclusion of a "Classic" race would please the audience.

Having no apparent knowledge of what this should look like, and probably no time, being very busy boys, they handed this problem over to some Wellington "expert" in the class. Enquiries by Datsun Z Club members brought the following response - "There'll be no Japanese in this race, it's for classic cars!". Our efforts to counter this at that time were too little and too late. We were not included.

This year's Nissan Mobil seemed to go back to that first time concept, so here we were again. Paul Hansen had gone to considerable effort and made many toll-calls in his endeavours to enter the event. Mainly as a result of a word or two from Nissan's Bruce White, Paul was assured of an entry. On Manfeild weekend I heard that Paul's entry would be returned, they'd found their excuse, there is no place in the event for cars fueled with C.N.G.



While Paul has been fighting for a place on the grid, Don McLean was also attempting to obtain an entry form. Don is as you know very well known south-of-the-Bombays and an exceptional competitor. He had been in direct contact with one of the persons appointed to accept entries for this race. Once more we

heard the same old answer, only the language had become stronger - "We won't have any Jap in the race".


These people could be accused of being "more British than the British", but I'm very sure this was not included in their reasoning. The Datsun 240Z is an internationally recognised classic sports car. This has even been proclaimed from the front covers of every notable British "Classic & Thoroughbred" car publication. The Historic Sports Car Club G.B. includes 240Z's in their national championship races. I could go on, but the argument has long since been won... It appears far more probable that their main problem related to the danger of a "Japcrap" win.

But then, just to rub it all in, we get to see the entry list for this MVDI Classic Invitation...

Of 44 entries a substantial percentage were either home-builts, purpose-built one-offs, semi-retired Shellsports or allcomers, and other full-race cars. Replicas, fakes and hotrods had been given precedence. Besides this, Aucklanders in the main were obviously excluded.

For those who may have missed something, "Classic" implies firstly "old" and secondly "significant". Our form of classic racing is a class for sporting or sports cars with an emphasis on "mass-production road-purposes", beit perhaps only a small mass. As soon as you allow modern limited production purpose-built race specials, one-offs, modernised oldies and look-alikes, you eliminate any possibilty of rules. These Wellington organisers have effectively told me that if I want to win in "their" race I should build a fake Cheetah with modern engine technology, handling and brakes, and move to Wellington!

This griping should not be aimed at just this one group (or are they one and the same?). Many others, even ourselves in a way, are bastardising classic racing in an apparent effort to build up entry numbers. It's an easy cop-out to present cars that New Zealand doesn't have such as D-type, C-type, or Cobra (when's Ford



going to sue the announcer for using that word?) to give your meeting glamour. Manfeild is another example.

Regardless of due compliments to M.G. Wellington, I find myself in difficulties with that same word "Classic" in the name for their annual event. I noted with a smile that one of the beautiful Almaes racing carried the numberplate "FAKE". Almacs may well be a marque and even a classic in time, but hardly would the "replica of the car that raced (unsuccessfully or otherwise) in 1961 which was probably in itself a replica of the car that" When you welcome 50-plus fakes, how could it ever be called a "classic" meeting? Somebody once produced an excellent list of qualifying cars (page 220 of the Manual), a list which ignored 3-series BMWs, XJSs, Hillmans, Twin-Turboed RX7s, Lotus A40s, Anglia V8s, and for the love of peanutslabs, 120Ys!

I think that what's evolving here will become a major issue, and that we should all be worrying about this whole trend. Every race meeting that we attend seems to be run under a different bunch of rules, and these rules appear to be coming increasingly flexible. Seems that most promoters write "Schedule T&C" into their Regs., then treat these rules with total ignore. Without rules we will have no definable class and eventually no (classic) racing. Inevitably we will find ourselves in the same position as the old "All Comers Sedan" class which collapsed in the '60s. Think about it.

GEOFFSPEAK

The British Flag-Marshalling Scene by your Capt. Geoff

On November 5th I excused myself from our Z committee meeting and joined Maureen at the Northern Sports Car Clubrooms for a special "Auckland Motorsport Marshals Association" (AMMA) meeting. We were treated to an impromptu lecture by two motorsport Brits who were on their way home after the Adelaide GP, but had been flagged-down here so to speak.

Our first speaker was John Felix who is a top COTC (Clerk of the Course) who covered the British track history and the marshalling structure. He was followed-up by Dr. Chris Ruddlesdin who covered the specifics of motorsport medical.

Britain has a very big motor racing hunger and has 2,500 marshals who cover all meetings, in all weathers, all year, and each pay NZ\$30 for the privilege.

An event fee is also paid to their Association which generates a total of NZ\$300 per year. This is a serious group who cover 284 track meetings on the 14 British tracks remembering that some of these meetings are five days long! All rallies and off-road events are also covered by this group, these guys 'n' gals are very busy.

Each is covered by insurance from the time that they leave their homes for the meet, through until they return.

Novices must wear a white marshals badge and attend a minimum of 10 events, a fire course and a film course. After 12 months they get a green badge and must do a another 10 events or more, then after a further 12 months they are promoted to red badges (fire) or blue badges (flagging). In order to become an observer (Point Chief) one must do a minimum of 12 months/10 events of each red and blue. This system guarantees that the Chiefs have marshalled at least 40 events over a minimum of four years.

There is a medical centre at all tracks equipped with doctor, nurse, blood, needles and string (!?). Broken drivers are brought in for de-truamatisation by special fast crash ambulances which always carry a doctor, along with special equipment such as the "jaws-of-life". These vehicles cost around NZ\$75,000 with gear. They have a 90-second rule for these special ambulances to reach the crash scene, therefore requiring more than one for the larger tracks. After the injured have been stabilised by the track's extensive/intensive-care medicentre, they are then taken on a casual trip to the local hospital.

As you can see, they treat safety in motor racing as paramount and it works very well indeed. The Association has real teeth and drivers who abuse the rules face a maximum of NZ\$500 fines at the discretion of the COTC. The yellow flag violation is no joke in Britain and can easily end in a no racing licence situation.

I fully endorse and envy their system. AMMA can be proud of the way they have covered events in the short period of their existence. As a driver as well as a member of AMMA I can tell you that the numbers have been out on the points, training has been going well, and the flagging has improved immensely and will get even better. Marshals all enjoy motor racing, they like it fast, furious, but safe. I have observed over these years that good, top drivers have always had a healthy respect for marshals and vice-versa, that's why good-clean racing is the only racing that's worth it. Let's all do our bit.

COMPETITION LICENCES

Members interested in competition will need to go through a few formalities in order to compete in events, in fact most of the events that the Z-Club promotes and all of the events to which we, as a club, are invited. This is just a brief explanation of what it all means.

Basic "Club" Licence:

A minimum requirement for all "Permitted" closed-club competition, excluding Racing. This Licence is issued by the M.A.N.Z.. The cost is \$11.25.

National Competition Licence: A "National" Licence is required for Closed-Club and all non_racing Invitation Status or Inter-marque competitions. This licence will cost you \$45.00, includes the N.Z. Motorsport Manual, plus your inclusion on the Motorsport News mailing list.

National Racing Licence: For those who wish to participate in RACING, your Competition Licence will require validating by an Approved Examiner. This involves calling on Graham Collins, passing a test on your knowledge of the racing flags and other rules, whereupon your licence will be endorsed "Racing".

POCKET PATCHES

The Z-Club has embroidered Pocket Patches available to members at \$5.50 (inc. Post & G.S.T.). Send payment to our postbox.

TRIALING BOOK
