

RALLY NEW ZEALAND - UPDATE

There's a new event on the rally calendar this year, if you've never tried off roading in your Zed this one might be worth looking at.... The Rally New Zealand Historic Rally will be held in association with the 1999 Rally New Zealand 15-18 July 1999.

Historic Rallying is growing in New Zealand and Rally New Zealand wish to promote this growth by holding a Historic Rally as part of the 1999 Rally New Zealand. It is intended that this will become an annual event.

The Rally New Zealand Historic Rally will have the following features:

- ⊕ Eligability restricted to non 4WD pre 1982 vehicles.
- Separate classes for modified and unmodified vehicles.
- Rally New Zealand Historic Rally competitors will run in a separate group and will use selected Special Stages immediately after the WRC event.
- Servicing will be relaxed with recommended service areas. No servicing will be allowed on the rally route.
- Competitors will be encouraged to display their cars at the official Rally overnight Parc Fermé
- Rejoining the event will be relaxed.
- Trophies will be awarded to Historic placegetters.
- Mostly daylight stages over two days plus the Super Stage on Thursday and Friday nights.
- Total stage distance around 200km
- No reconnaissance will be allowed and Pace Notes are prohibited.
- Entry Fee \$500 including GST.
- Supplementary Regulations will be available shortly.

The Great Z Club Magazine Official Interview

Tell us about your Zed.

Born in 1972, there's not much left that hails from that vintage though. I've had it for nearly 12 years now. I originally bought it as a road/race car and intended to leave it as a dual purpose effort... oh well, so much for the plan! It's now just a "shopping basket" only driven on Sundays and then only when it's dry...

2. History of car?

Where to start? It's had a number of rebuilds and re-engines and re-gearboxes and re-diffs and (more recently) re-drive shafts over the years. I won the TACCOC Sports & GT Challenge a couple of years running if that counts for anything?

I was the first person to race this car as far as we know. Allan Harrison had not seen it before (quite an unusual state of affairs). Over the years it has been slowly (!) developed with the specific intention of being faster every time it goes on the track. Not an easy feat when you look at the range of drivers the car has had over the years...

3. When did you join the Z Club, how did you hear about us?

I joined the club not long after returning from Hong Kong in '86, does that make me old? Both my mum and I had purchased 280ZX's in Hong Kong with the intention of brining back these "Grand Touring" cars so we could pose in New Zealand. My dad found an advertisement for some race meeting or another at Pukekohe so out we went and there was Graham Collins and Dale Maxwell going hammer and tongs on the track. I joined the club very shortly afterwards and my application form specifically excluded racing and speed events — I didn't want to risk my expensive performance car you see...

Anyway, it didn't take too many race meetings before my ego formed the opinion that I could do a better job than the others racing their Zeds. I did my first Baypark event in the 280 and tried to race it for a while (boy what a waste of effort!). I finally started to look for a real race car and ended up with the current "toy".

 Is your car purpose built, street raced, daily transport, business vehicle? Yes.

5. Future plans?

Next season will see (hopefully) a bigger/better engine in the car. Contrary to popular belief, the current engine is a real "cheapy". The target will be to get into the 65 second mark next season. This is realistic bearing in mind that car was turning consistent 67's on Zed day with a few 66's thrown in for good measure.

Worst moment in your Zed?

Watching Gerhard Weavers drive it over a bank when I was sitting in the car directly behind him. Or was it watching as a Lotus Seven did a neat guillotine job on the front left corner of the car at the hairpin? Or was it the helpless feeling as the Porsche spun just a few feet in front of me in the wet? Or was it sitting watching the car overheat at Wellington as the boys changed the wheel which I'd just destroyed on the chicane (that damn camera never did work again after I "got it")? There's so many, you be the judge... No, wait, I have it: qualify second overall at Zed day, warm up the tyres and car and then blow a half-shaft on the start grid!

Best time you have had with your Zed?

Qualifying well at the recent Zed day and coming through that same field from back-of-grid starts (Guess I was afraid of the half-shafts!).



MEMBERSHIP DISCOUNTS

Members of this Club are able to avail themselves of discounts on quite a number of products and services. The list is ever-changing and at times complex, making it difficult to publish here. The best way is to ask someone of the Committee before you buy.

Holders of M.A.N.Z. licences (see below) qualify for a very extensive list of discounted items.

COMPETITION LICENCES

You do not require a Competition Licence for Motorkhanas, Trials Hill-climbs or Sprints, provided these aren't interclub competitions.

Members interested in more serious competition will need to go through a few formalities in order to participate. This is just a brief explanation of what it all means.

Regional Licence:

This licence is the minimum requirement for all "Regional" MANZ, permitted competitions, as well as being required for all dosed-dub. Racing or Rallying. This Licence is issued by the MANZ. The cost is \$28.13.

National Competition Licence:
This Licence is required for "National"
status non-racing competitions. The cost
is \$56.25, includes the N.Z. Motorsport
Manual, pits your inclusion on the
Motorsport News mailing list.

National Racing Licence:

We recommend to those who wish to participate in <u>RACING</u> that you obtain a National Competition Licence in the first place, study-up on the Rules, then have it up-graded by an Approved Examiner. This involves calling on an examiner listed in the front of the MANZ book, passing a test on your knowledge of the racing flags and other rules, whereupon your licence will be endorsed "Racing".

POCKET PATCHES

The Z-Club has embroidered Pocket Patches available to members at \$7.50 (inc. Post & G.S.T.). Send payment to our postbox.

TRIALING BOOK

If you're one of those Trials Enthusiasts, our reproduced Trialing Book will be of great interest and value. Order through our postbox at \$4.00 - Trust me, it will help!

THE POSTCARD

When you first joined the Z-Club, included with your New Member's Pack were some of those printed-blue postcards. We know -you filed them, didn't you? These cards are our main membership-drive tool, and they work real well when they're used.
